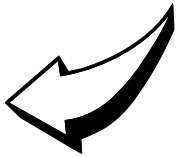

April 9 at 7:00 pm

Holy Week begins on Palm Sunday and concludes on Easter Sunday. During this final week of Christ’s life we see the culmination of His love for us beginning in the crowded streets of Jerusalem as we proclaim, “Hosanna to the King!” to the upper room where Jesus offers the disciples His body and blood, to the hill called Calvary. Holy Week then concludes with Jesus’ triumph over the grave and the celebration of His glorious resurrection on Easter Sunday.

In order to offer a more complete picture of Holy Week, the Music Ministry will present “Harvest of Sorrows” on Maundy Thursday. In this dramatic portrayal the choir will lead us in a stirring musical depicting the mood and the message of our Savior. We encourage you to enter this time of worship prepared to hear the words of Jesus and receive the elements of the Lord’s Supper.

Some of you may still be wondering **“What is Maundy Thursday?”**

Answer: Maundy Thursday, also known as “Holy Thursday” is the name given to the day on which Jesus celebrated the Passover with His disciples, known as the Last Supper. The two important events of Maundy Thursday are the Lord’s Supper and the Washing of the disciple’s feet.

I hope you will make this a part of your Holy Week worship experience. Our observance of Christ in the Upper Room, along with remembering the brutal road to Calvary can only heighten the anticipation of Easter and Christ’s defeating death and His glorious resurrection. Let us join together as we prepare for truly a Holy Week.
